

From the Pastor's Heart...

In keeping with my recent sermon series on "Why? Making Sense of God's Will," I offer you a book review on author Kate Bowler's "Everything Happens for a Reason – And Other Lies I have Loved." Kate Bowler is a professor at Duke Divinity School with a modest Christian upbringing, but she specializes in the study of the prosperity gospel, a creed that sees fortune as a blessing from God and misfortune as a mark of God's disapproval. At thirty-five, everything in her life seems to point toward "blessing." She is thriving in her job, married to her high school sweetheart, and loves life with her newborn son.

Then she is diagnosed with stage IV colon cancer.

The prospect of her own mortality forces Kate to realize that she has been quietly subscribing to the prosperity gospel, living with the conviction that she can control the shape of her life with "a surge of determination." Even as this type of Christianity celebrates the American can-do spirit, it implies that if you "can't do" and succumb to illness or misfortune, you are a failure. Kate is very sick, and no amount of positive thinking will shrink her tumors. What does it mean to die, she wonders, in a society that insists everything happens for a reason? Kate is stripped of this certainty only to discover that without it, life is hard but beautiful in a way it never has been before.

I became acquainted with Bowler's book while going through my Chaplain Residency at the University of Virginia, 2017-2018. As most of you are aware, I view this pithy Christian

platitude "everything happens for a reason," with a hugely skeptical eye. I have come to this conclusion both in my own personal experiences and through sharing in the lives of my congregants for nearly 20 years.

One of the excerpts from Bowler's book which had the most impact upon me is when Kate shares about her old Sunday school teacher, Carol, who helped her get into her sheep costume for the Christmas pageant year after year. "A couple of Christmases ago, I saw Carol over one of the pews and reached out to give her a hug, remembering only at the last second that she had recently been diagnosed with cancer. I couldn't figure out what to say when we pulled away and I found I was just staring into her smiling face, stammering something about how sorry I was. She looked back at me with such calm and said something I had never heard anyone say. "I have known Christ in so many good times," she said, sincerely and directly, "and now I will know Him in his sufferings." WOW! I all my years of ministry, I have never encountered such an attitude. Later, Bowler comments that while she was sure Carol wanted and prayed for healing – she prayed for more than to be spared. She prayed in the long night of Advent that her waiting would end with a better angle of vision on the baby born to die. Again, WOW.

I recognize this Christian platitude does bring comfort to some people which I would never want to destroy. My caution in our attempt to comfort another who has either received bad news, or is in the midst of a crisis, is to be mindful of both possibilities – that while the words, "Everything happens for a reason," is comforting to some; for others it sounds flip and uncaring. Our American stick-to-itiveness often leaves us feeling helpless in the face of tragedy and disease and there often is nothing worse for our "can do" spirit when we realize we just don't have that much power. We cannot fix everything. Like that adorable picture circulating the internet of a dog wearing the "cone of shame," with a kitten lying close inside the cone comforting him – this is not the only thing you and I can do in the midst of comforting another person...it is the BEST thing we can do.



Frank and funny, dark and wise, Kate Bowler pulls the reader deeply into her life in an account she populates affectionately with a colorful, often hilarious retinue of friends, mega-church preachers, relatives, and doctors. "Everything Happens for a Reason" tells her story, offering up her irreverent, hard-won observations on dying and the ways it has taught her to live. This can be a challenging read, but a good one.

ONLINE GIVING - INTERESTED?

The Finance Committee is researching and considering the option of online giving. We have been looking into several different platforms and PayPal seems to be our best option. PayPal will give our donors a secure way to donate electronically without having to share their full financial information. It will also offer the convenience of setting up recurring donations, making donations even if you miss a Sunday and eliminate the need to write a check or obtain cash for your Sunday morning envelope. As a non-profit, PayPal would charge us a fee of 2.2% of the donation + a .30 fee per transaction. What does this mean? Here's an example, if you make a \$50.00 donation, PayPal would charge \$1.40 in fees and the church would receive a donation of \$48.60. The donor has the option of choosing whether to increase the donation by a few dollars in order to cover the applicable fees.

Before we delve too far into the process, we'd like to see how many members would be interested in utilizing this option.
